A Guide to the Evening Worship

The Psalms, Hymns, and Spiritual Songs

Out of My Bondage – Hearing the report of the repentance of the Ninevites ought to lead us to consider our own sins and God's mercy to us in Christ. Use the words of this song to express your heartfelt penitence and sorrow for your sin, together with your trust in Christ and desires for new obedience.

Day by Day – The truth of God's sovereignty over all things has many uses in the Christian's life; that is, it is not merely a truth that floats around in our heads, but it is a truth for life, a truth that changes our outlook and manner of living. As this hymn declares, it is a truth that brings comfort to those in distress and confidence to those who are hopeless. May God always cause His truth to transform our lives!

The Benediction – As God invites and commands us to worship, so He sends us out with His good word of grace. Our benedictions at GPC are drawn from the Bible, usually from the epistles. Go in the strength the Lord provides!

A Guide to the Morning Service

Worship and the Word of God – Presbyterians believe that the Word of God should be central in worship. God regulates how His people worship Him by His word. We are not free to do anything we want, or anything that hasn't been forbidden. Only that which has been positively commanded by God should be offered to Him in worship (see Exo. 20:4-6; Lev. 10:1-3; Deut. 12:8; Col. 2:23; I Cor. 14:33). Not only do we read the Bible and preach the Bible in our services, we also aim to pray the Bible, confess the Bible, and sing the Bible, choosing songs that are based on Scripture (psalms) or filled with biblical content. It is by the word that sinners are converted and Christians grow (see I Pet. 1:23; 2:1-3), so pray for God to bless His word!

The Tithes and Offerings – From the apostolic era the church has worshipped God by taking up a collection for the saints on the Lord's Day (I Cor. 16:1-2), and we follow that practice. We support the work of our church and all our missionaries and benevolent ministries from the regular offering. The self-giving of Jesus Christ, not merely the tithe, is the Christian's standard in giving (II Cor. 8:9; 9:7) – are you giving in obedience to and in imitation of your Lord?

Have you ever wondered, "What am I supposed to do as the offering plate is passed around?" Chuck Swindoll offers these suggestions to redeem the time:

1. Take a pencil along with the bulletin and write down a list of the things for which you are most grateful. Ponder each and thank your heavenly Father for them one by one. Tape that list in a conspicuous place at home and look at it daily for a week.
2. Close your eyes. Refuse every outside thought that knocks for entrance. Think back over the week that's passed. Praise God for His assistance. Thank Him for your role in life, your job, your loved ones, your church, your spiritual gifts, your salvation, your trials, your destiny, your health, the Scriptures.
3. Pick out two or three people whom you know (perhaps some sitting with or near you) and pray specifically for them. Ask God to encourage them by the means of grace that day. You might even follow up by greeting them after the service and expressing interest in their lives. Tell them that the Spirit led you to pray for them.
4. Turn to the Scripture that will be used in the sermon. Read it over slowly. Meditate upon it throughout the offering time. Ask God to speak to you through it.
5. Pray for the one who will bring the message. Ask God to give him liberty, clarity, boldness, sensitivity, insight on his feet, freedom from distractions and petty worries.
